Sault Naturalists Executive Meeting May 7, 2015 7:00 pm



The meeting was held at the Civic Centre, Sault Ste. Marie Ontario.

- 1. Call to order at 7:02
- 2. Additions to the agenda: Hub Trail Festival
- 3. Motion: Accept the minutes as printed moved by Tony, seconded by Robert. Motion carried.
- 4. Business arising from the minutes from last meeting:
 - a) Review of proposed 2015 Budget (attached) The 2015 revenue is calculated as if all members on May 07 have paid in full. Expenses associated with the recent platform repair are approximately \$1000 (not the estimated \$300 in the proposed budget). A discussion ensued that the platform expenses were if fact previously budgeted for with monies remaining from the original platform grant. As a result, these repair expenses have no impact on the 2015 projected operating budget.

ACTION: Ron to report to the membership explaining the use of monies from the original provincial grant that have been set aside for platform repairs.

Motion: The Executive to follow due process and ask for membership approval for platform repair expenditure – moved by Tony, no seconder. Motion lost.

ACTION: Ron to revise proposed budget including actual cost of platform repairs.

 Dave reports that he has good support from members and local agencies.

- d) Platform inspection and repair
 Ron thanked Dave, Don and Tony for organization and direction, Viv and Val for their support.

Dave mentioned the work on the Pumpkin Point platform repairs are not yet finished. Work party planning is in the works to complete repairs (deck and kick boards mostly) in June for half a day.

Motion: Charges for food supplied to the platform work party be taken from the Club's general coffers – moved by Robert, seconded by Jeff. Motion carried.

Motion: Start a special fund intended to replace old platforms - moved by Dave, seconded by Mark.

Motion carried.

Motion: Add a box to membership form called 'Contribution to Special Projects' to where members can donate funds – moved by Jeff, seconded by Robert.

Motion carried.

ACTION: Chuck to investigate grant options for platform replacement and report at the next meeting.

ACTION: Ron to contact the City of SSM Parks & Recreation Department to determine if we can play a role in their Master Plan revision.

e) Swift monitoring days

May 20, 24, 28 and June 01 are National Roosting Monitoring Blitz. The Club is planning a Swift Night Festival one of these 4 days to increase awareness of Chimney Swifts in the city and their plight as a threatened species. Ron encouraged the Executive to support this event.

Motion: Sunday May 24 to be the date of our Swift Night Festival at the Cenotaph on Queen St – moved by Jeff, seconded by Robert. Motion carried.

f) Sault Ste. Marie Science Festival report Ron and Val reported that the Club participated on May 02 in this inaugural event at The Machine Shop at Millsquare with display boards and a cone identification challenge. John Ralston's swift video of the birds entering the Courthouse chimney played, Chimney Swift fact sheets and Sault Naturalists brochures were available.

Dave reported that he had the Sault Naturalists display board set up during an Earth Day celebration at Mill Market on April 22.

g) Creek revitalization with Lake Superior Watershed Conservancy (LSWC) Chuck and Ron travelled to Petoskey for a meeting with the Tip of Mitt Watershed Conservancy (TMWC) to discuss what was required and the

nature of their support regarding local creek revitalization. Ruth O'Gawa (LSWC) and Mike Ripley (BPAC member) were present. At a Creek Revitalization Project sub-committee meeting (Ron, Don, Chuck, Val) on May 05, an ACTION Plan was determined:

- forego stream monitoring offered by TMWC
- conduct more field investigation of SSM urban streams, Bennett Creek in particular
- access data collected by Corina Barrett (Algoma University) on city creeks
- involve the Conservation Authority Sault College, Essar and the City of Sault Ste. Marie regarding support for creek revitalization
- as a minimum, organize an outing to clean up Bennett Creek (remove tires, bikes, shopping carts)
- consider what we can do realistically, moving forward at a methodical pace

h) Renaming St. Joe's property

Dave is planning a ceremony for the renaming of the Ontario Nature preserve on the island. Ontario Nature head office and Township representatives, Gladys and her family, and the membership are invited. As yet, the name of the preserve is undecided. The original name The Gladys and Cliff Wallwork Nature Preserve, is deemed by ON to be too long. Dave is wrestling with what the name will be.

A sign bearing the name of the preserve will be erected at the site prior to the formal ceremony. Donna will contribute 2 cedar posts and Dave will organizing the work party to auger the post holes and erect the sign. The ceremony will be simple, located at the preserve followed by a walk to the showy lady slipper location.
